SUMMARY

This deliverable contains all updates and changes made to the initial Data management Plan (DMP) during the project TOSCA. The initial version has been presented in deliverable D1.1. The purpose of this deliverable is to provide a description of all changes concerning data collection, generation and processing by the project during its lifetime, and to update the TOSCA consortium's data management policy and procedures.

General guidelines and adherence to data principles such as the FAIR principles for scientific data management will remain mostly unchanged and still valid. Pertaining to these guidelines, the DMP also includes information on how non-confidential research data will be made available to other researchers.

Most of the updates and changes to the initial DMP concern the detailed description of every dataset produced over the course of the project, listed in the appendices of both deliverables. Many of the various properties of the datasets were not fully known or could only be approximated at the start of the project, when D1.1 was submitted. Now, with most of the datasets already actually existing, the table of dataset descriptions can be fully updated and completed.

However, as the data identification and collection activities are still ongoing, the updated DMP will not include a final scenario of the datasets definitions that are needed in the TOSCA project and will still be subject to change.
